'Bharatiyakaran' is not about India, the Indian knowledge system, the attainments in the field of knowledge through Indian history, from the ancient past through the medieval period into the modern period, but focuses specifically on the ancient period. They say this needs to be called out as communalisation, rather than seeing it as idiosyncrasies. These allegations are to be taken into account and it is necessary to make education aligned to the 'Idea of India'.

We need to plan for excellence and advancement of society in all its domains, but only by balancing excellence with equity. If education is to be an institution to fulfil constitutional guarantees, we need to look at policy and practice from the lens of social justice. 
Animal Sacrifice in Shrines of Himachal: Question of Belief and Rationality
