## REPORT OF A TALK ON 'PREPARATION FOR COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS'

Departments of Political Science, Sociology and Maths under the banner of "The Career Guidance Cell" of Government Degree College Chail-Koti organized a lecture on 'Preparation for Competitive Examinations' on 22th September 2024 for the students of BA. Resource person was Mr Rajneesh Dogra preparing for Civil Services Exams since last three years.
